

Playing formats - Blasters

Players	6 per team			
Overs	12 per innings			
Duration	60-75 mins			
Pitch Length	14m (stump to stump)			
Boundary	20m - 30m (adjusted for skill level)			
Ball	Blast Ball (soft rubber)			
Bowling / Fielding	Bowl all overs from one end			
	After each over, fielding team rotates in a circular formation			
	No fielders within 10m of batter			
	 No balls / wides not re-bowled (one free hit from tee) 			
	 No balls: cannot be hit because bounced too many times / rolling, above waist height on full. 			
	Wickets = 5 bonus runs to bowling team			
Batting	Batters in pairs for 4 overs			
	 Batters swap ends when dismissed or at end of over 			
	 Batters swap ends if a batter faces 3 balls in a row 			
	• Umpires to ensure each batter faces <i>approx</i> . 12 balls each			
	• No LBW			
	Power Play Zone = double runs			



Free Hit Tees

Mark the crease (approx. 1.2 metres from stumps) and act as wide markers.



Fielders are not allowed within 10 metres of the bat until the ball is hit (excluding the wicketkeeper).

Power Play Zone

All runs scored in this area are doubled (overthrows are not doubled).

Many volunteers make a team

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- An 'evolution' of community club-level coaching.
- Managers:
 - Set up a WhatsApp group for all parents
 - ✓ Publish game details during the week: time, opponent, location/map, etc.
 - ✓ Manage player attendance for games, arrange a scorer, umpire, gazebo, snacks, etc.
- Scorers:
 - ✓ Paper scoring and e-scoring required (depending on home/away)
 - ✓ E-scoring guides for PlayHQ are online (refer to LWCC Cricket Hub), plus e-scoring courses.
- Trainers / 'net captains':
 - ✓ Anyone can help at training/games: parents/guardians, older siblings; no cricket experience required!
 - ✓ Help keep the focus, e.g. "next bowler up" in the nets, throwing/hitting balls in the field, timing batter rotation, batter 'throw downs' at games, running stretches/warm-ups, general 'wrangling', etc.
 - ✓ Aim is to allow coaches to focus on coaching and skill development, which often requires some oneon-one time with individual players.
- Umpires for junior teams, no qualifications necessary, just read the rules sheet for your format.
- Oaches:
 - Every team needs an appointed coach to be able to record games in PlayHQ.
 - ✓ All coaches need a valid Working With Children certification (which is free through Service NSW).

Spirit of cricket

Cricket owes much of its appeal and enjoyment to the fact that it should be played not only according to the Laws, but also **within the Spirit of Cricket**. The major responsibility for ensuring fair play rests with the captains, but extends to all players, match officials and, **especially in junior cricket, teachers, coaches and parents**.



Respect is central to the Spirit of Cricket.

- Respect your captain, team-mates, opponents and the authority of the umpires.
- Play hard and play fair.
- Accept the umpire's decision.
- Create a positive atmosphere by your own conduct, and encourage others to do likewise.
- Show self-discipline, even when things go against you.
- Congratulate the opposition on their successes, and enjoy those of your own team.
- Thank the officials and your opposition at the end of the match, whatever the result.

Cricket is an exciting game that encourages leadership, friendship and teamwork, which brings together people from different nationalities, cultures and religions, especially when played within the Spirit of Cricket.



Game day tips - part 1

- It's all about kids, not parents! Set the example.
- Be positive, be patient. Train how you want to play!
- LWCC junior incidents:
 - ∠ 2023-24 tally = zero
 - ∠ 2024-25 tally = zero
 - ∠ 2025-26 target = zero!
- Blasters & junior cricket is all about rotation, balance and an equal go for all players, regardless of skill.
- Coaches to use their judgement to balance "match ups", e.g. play a stronger batting pair against stronger bowlers and vice versa.
- Aids with fostering enjoyment for all players in their initial years playing cricket - we want our kids to enjoy the game, so they come back for more next season!





Game day tips - part 2

- Communication is key!
 - Pre-game talk through rules with opposing coach / umpire
 - ✓ Use chalk / tape to mark creases and guide markers for wides
 - Typically, with younger age groups, bowlers are initially given warnings for front foot no balls, before no balls are called for subsequent deliveries (agree with other team pre-game)
 - Aim for consistency between innings
- Dismissals (U12+)
 - Batting team umpire to stand at bowler's end for duration of innings
 - ✓ LBW decisions should be plum, give benefit of the doubt to batter
- Weather:
 - Extreme heat policy on Cricket Hub please refer.
 - Rain unless formally cancelled prior, everyone needs to show up to the ground during wet weather, expecting to play.
 - ✓ Teams/coaches to assess conditions and use discretion to mutually agree to call off play if there is any risk of injury or danger (e.g. lightning).





Wanderers Medal

- Known as the 'Noella Merrick Medal' until 2024
- Our cricket club's most prestigious award:

"The Medal is awarded to a junior cricketer who has modelled the Spirit of Cricket and made a substantial contribution to the life of the club, on and off the field. Previous winners have included junior cricketers who have coached and supported younger teams, trained parents in online scoring or led and motivated team-mates. We encourage nominees from all age groups and nominations can be made by any club member or their family."

- Written nominations with description of player achievements & contributions welcome towards end of season
- Nominees and winners announced on Presentation Day, alongside male & female champion players





SCL - Code of Conduct

- For 2025/26 cricket season, Cricket NSW is introducing a mandatory Code of Conduct training requirement for every team participating in SCL competitions.
- Training Requirement & Purpose:
 - ✓ All teams must ensure that two nominated representatives complete Code
 of Conduct training by the commencement of Round 3 of the competition.
 - ✓ This initiative is designed to ensure a minimum understanding of code of conduct and the relevant processes within every team and to proactively reduce the frequency and severity of incidents, helping us maintain a safe and respectful environment for all participants, volunteers, and supporters.
- Process Details:
 - Each team must nominate two representatives.
 - ✓ Both representatives are required to watch a short 8-minute video available on the CNSW website.
 - ✓ After viewing the video, they must complete and submit a declaration confirming their understanding of the Code of Conduct processes <u>prior to</u> Round 3. More to follow from the LWCC committee.







Child safety

- Everyone in this room is responsible for looking out for the safety of children and young people.
- Our club has made a commitment to children and young people and their parents/guardians to provide a safe physical and online environment for all children and young people.
- Coaches, junior co-ordinators and Blast co-ordinators engage most frequently with children and young people. You need to follow our Code of Behaviour and look out for the safety of junior members.
